Participants in Ontario Family Fishing Weekend must abide by the conservation regulations set out in the current Ontario Recreational Fishing Summary, which is available at Canadian Tire and other sporting goods stores.

Fishing is a healthy, outdoor tradition that helps support conservation, contributes to the economy and strengthens families. For kids, in particular, fishing is a confidence-building activity and a refreshing disconnection from computers and television.

Throughout the summer, including Ontario Family Fishing Weekend, aspiring anglers can catch free fishing lessons courtesy of the O.F.A.H. Travelling Tackle Share, an outreach program that is now touring Ontario Parks, public libraries and Big Brothers organizations across the province. **O.F.A.H.
